7. What if I don't see results immediately? Spiritual growth is a journey, not a destination. Be patient and consistent with your practice, and you will see positive changes over time.
8. Can I use this with other spiritual practices? Yes, the Liturgy of the Ordinary complements other spiritual practices, enriching your overall spiritual life.
9. Where can I get support if I need it? Consider joining a spiritual community or finding a mentor or spiritual guide for additional support.
