Such heady reconceptions continued until the disaster of the Second Crusade and with it, the collapse of any dreams of unification or salvation--any notion that conquering the Holy Land and defeating the Infidel could absolve sin. In *Nebuchadnezzar's Dream*, Jay Rubenstein boldly maps out the steps by which these social, political, economic, and intellectual shifts occurred throughout the 12th century, drawing on those who guided and explained them. The Crusades raised the possibility of imagining the Apocalypse as more than prophecy but actual event.
