It originated as a children's game, but has since taken on a new life as a lowest-common-denominator litmus test for assessing computer programmers. If you are an experienced programmer, it is an extremely easy problem to solve. Because of this, it has taken on a third life as the prototypical bad interview problem. Everyone knows that it's the question you ask people to make sure that they're not completely incompetent as programmers.
