Site-specifically located in North Bennington, where Jackson wrote *The Haunting of Hill House*, *Queer Paranormal* installed artworks in indoor and outdoor locations across the Bennington campus, including the Jennings music building—a former mansion believed to be haunted and said to have partly influenced Jackson's portrait of Hill House.
